Foolish Trust

- ⁴ Do not answer a fool according to his folly, or you yourself will be just like him.
- ⁵ Answer a fool according to his folly, or he will be wise in his own eyes. ⁶ Sending a message by the hands of a fool is like cutting off one's feet or drinking poison.
- ⁷ Like the useless legs of one who is lame is a proverb in the mouth of a fool.
- ⁸ Like tying a stone in a sling is the giving of honor to a fool. ⁹ Like a thornbush in a drunkard's hand is a proverb in the mouth of a fool. ¹⁰ Like an archer who wounds at random is one who hires a fool or any passer-by. ¹¹ As a dog returns to its vomit, so fools repeat their folly. ¹² Do you see a person wise in their own eyes? There is more hope for a fool than for them.

• Hatred
