- Context
 - Who is writing or speaking?
 - To whom is it written or spoken?
 - Who is present in the writing?
 - What are the extenuating circumstances?
 - What are the challenges being addressed or faced?
- What is the truth that is communicated?
- How does that truth apply to my life?

- 1. Caesarea Philippi The Gates of Hell
 - A. Background
 - Located at the foot of Mount <u>Hermon</u>.
 - In Old Testament times there was a shrine dedicated to <u>Baal</u>.
 - The Greeks later built a shrine to <u>Pan</u> the god of nature.
 - <u>Herod Philip</u> enlarged and beautified the place and renamed it to gain favor with the Roman emperor, <u>Tiberias Caesar</u>.

- B. Significance Scripture
 - Place where Jesus taught the disciples about the <u>church</u> and His redemptive role Matthew 16:13-28
 - Caesarea Philippi is the center of <u>pagan</u> worship in Israel.
 - Jesus examines their <u>beliefs</u> regarding Him.
 - Simon Peter proclaims that Jesus is the <u>Messiah</u> and the Son of God.
 - Jesus gives a promise of the church's <u>power</u> and <u>authority</u>.
 - Binding and loosing is a promise of <u>understanding</u> and <u>interpreting</u> the will of God. (see Matthew 6:9-13).

- 2. Paths of Righteousness Psalm 23
 - A. Scripture

The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I lack. He lets me lie down in green pastures; He leads me beside quiet waters. He renews my life; He leads me along paths of righteousness for His name's sake.

- B. Significance
 - Paths of righteousness were paths <u>previously</u> used by other animals.
 - Paths of righteousness always led to either <u>water</u> or <u>safety</u>.
 - When God leads me in paths of righteousness, it always leads me to a place of <u>refreshing</u> and <u>safety</u>.
 - God leads me for His <u>name's</u> sake, which means it is always for my <u>good</u>.
 - God only leads me where He has <u>already been</u>.
